# April may be wetter, cooler than usual

IMD says east, central and northwest India may witness more heatwave days than normal during April-June

New Delhi, 31 March

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Tuesday said maximum temperatures in April are likely to be normal to below normal across many parts of the country, with rainfall expected to reach 112 per cent of the long period average (LPA).

Most weather models also indicate the potential development of El Niño during the Indian southwest monsoon season, which begins after June.

The met department, however, did not specify whether El Niño would affect the monsoon, saying that detailed projections would be provided in its annual monsoon forecast in mid-April. "The Indian monsoon does not depend on a



single factor but on a multitude of events," IMD Director General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said.

He added that models suggest the Indian Ocean Dipole — another

key influence on the monsoon — is expected to be positive in the latter half of the season.

If April turns out to be wetter and cooler than normal in North

and Central India, it could affect standing late-sown rabi crops.

The IMD also said that parts of East, Central, and Northwest India, along with the Southeast Peninsula, may experience more heatwave days than usual between April and June.

During this period, maximum temperatures are expected to be normal to below normal over much of the country, except in most parts of East and Northeast India, Eastern Central India, and adjoining peninsular regions, where above-normal maximum temperatures are likely.

"During the hot season (April-June), above-normal minimum temperatures are likely over most parts of the country, except in some regions of Maharashtra and Telangana, where minimum tem-

peratures are expected to be normal to below normal," IMD said.

For April specifically, monthly maximum temperatures are expected to be normal to below normal across many areas, with above-normal temperatures predicted in parts of East and Northeast India, some regions of Northwest India, and Southern Peninsular India.

Above-normal monthly minimum temperatures are also likely across most of India, except for isolated pockets in the Southern Peninsula, where normal minimums are expected.

"Normal to above-normal rainfall is likely over most parts of the country except Northeast India, where below-normal rainfall is expected," IMD added.

# Mumbai sees most property registrations in 14 years

Mumbai, 31 March

Mumbai city (area under Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation or BMC jurisdiction) recorded 15,516 property registrations in March 2026, the highest monthly number for March in 14 years, according to data from the Maharashtra Department of Registrations and Stamps analysed by Knight Frank India.

The registrations in March 2026 generated over ₹1,492 crore in stamp duty revenue for the state exchequer. The registrations include both new sales and re-sales.

On a year-on-year (Y-o-Y) basis, registrations remained flat.

March 2025 saw 15,501 property registrations. Stamp duty collections, however, were lower by 6 per cent Y-o-Y, primarily reflecting a shift in transaction mix.

On a sequential basis, activity strengthened notably as the financial year drew to a close. Registrations rose 19 per cent month-on-month (M-o-M).

At the same time, stamp duty collections

increased by 32 per cent M-o-M, indicating sustained end-user demand supported by stable macroeconomic conditions, ongoing infrastructure upgrades, and positive buyer sentiment, Knight Frank added.

Residential properties continued to dominate, accounting for nearly 80 per cent of total registrations.

Shishir Bajjal, international partner, chairperson and managing director, Knight Frank India, said, "Mumbai's residential market has demonstrated a notable growth. March 2026 registrations surpassed last year's already-elevated base to record the strongest March in over a decade. This growth reiterates the depth of end-user demand in the city."

Bajjal said the momentum is particularly evident in the mid-income segment, where aspiring homeowners are actively upgrading to better quality housing within accessible price bands. "While variations in stamp duty collections reflect a shift in ticket size mix, the steady rise in transaction volumes highlights a structurally healthy market," he added.

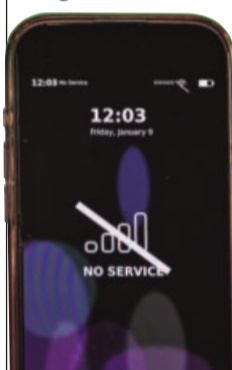
# India enforced 65 internet shutdowns in 2025

India continued to rank among the global leaders in imposing internet shutdowns, recording 65 connectivity blackouts in 2025, according to a report by Access Now and the #KeptOn coalition.

Globally, at least 313 internet shutdowns were documented across 52 countries last year. Malaysia topped the list with 95 shutdowns. In 2024, there were 304 reported shutdowns, driven by issues such as conflict management, protests, political instability, information control, and efforts to curb communal violence. In several countries — including Belarus, Cameroon, Guinea, Myanmar, Pakistan, Tanzania, Uganda, and Venezuela — authorities imposed internet cuts 12 times during election periods in 2025.

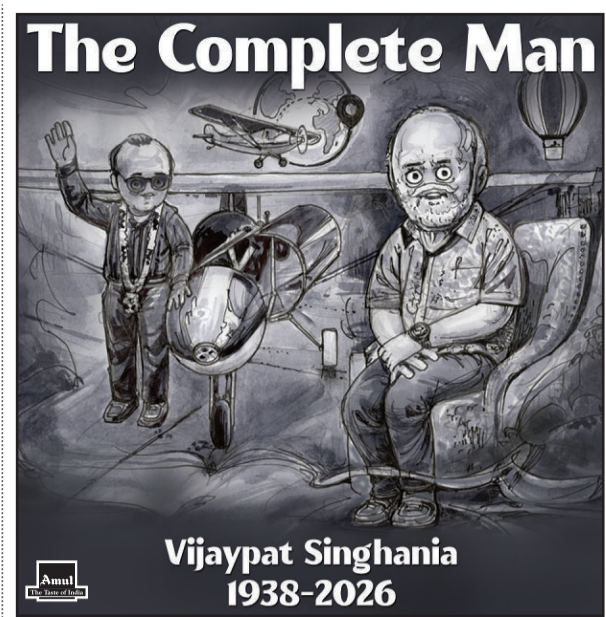
Among social media platforms, Facebook faced 31 shutdowns across 18 countries in 2025, while WhatsApp was blocked 27 times in 13 countries. Messaging service Telegram was cut off 23 times in 16 countries, and Instagram was restricted 20 times in 11 countries over the same period.

# Policy vs reality: Hurdles to transgender welfare schemes

As the Transgender Amendment Bill gets the President's assent amid concerns, a picture from the ground

Simran Singh, a transgender woman in her 30s, now owns a small house in Thane, outside Mumbai in Maharashtra. After honing her skills at a Gramin Greh shelter, and learning soap-making, she launched her own business in 2024.

The Gramin Greh initiative, launched as a pilot in 2020 across 10 cities by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, has since expanded to 15 cities. For Simran, the turning point came in 2023, when she received her transgender identity (TGID) card, a government issued document recognising her gender identity.

"It gave me a fresh sense of identity," she says. "I could access NGO and corporate funding. Even getting a home loan became easier." But such stories remain an exception.

The National Portal for Transgender Persons, launched in 2020 after the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act of 2019, enabled registration for TGID card — a prerequisite for accessing government schemes such as Garima Greh shelters, scholarships, and health insurance.

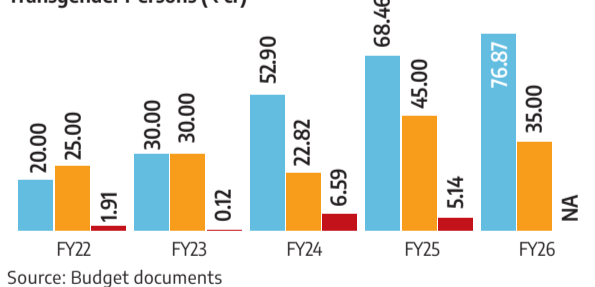
Yet, uptake has been limited. Data on the portal shows that as of 5 pm on March 31, 37,360 applications had been filed, and 32,630 TGID cards issued. That's 6.8 per cent TGID cards issued, given India's transgender population of over 480,000, according to the 2011 Census. Applicants, activists, and NGOs point to multiple barriers: Funding gaps, bureaucratic delays, low awareness, for instance.

Concerns have deepened with the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Amendment Bill, 2026, which received the President's assent late Monday. The amendments remove the self-identification-based definition recognised by the Supreme Court in 2014, and introduce a narrower definition

that includes socio-cultural identities, intersex persons, and those forced into transgender identities. "There's no exact figure, but this definition could make at least 40 per cent of transgender persons ineligible for TGID card," says Kalki Subramaniam, former South India representative for the National Council for Transgender Persons, who resigned on March 25 in protest.

Uncertainty also surrounds those who already hold TGID cards. "The amendments hint at retrospective application, which is legally unlikely," says Aqsa Shaikh, professor of community medicine at Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, and a transgender rights activist. "This was flagged in Parliament." An email sent to the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment did not elicit a response till the time of going to print.

## Schemes & scorecard

In 2022, following the portal's launch and the Garima Greh pilot, the government launched the Central Sector Scheme for Comprehensive Rehabilitation for Welfare of Transgender Persons. It promised scholarships from Class IX to postgraduate levels, skill development, health insurance, and more Garima Greh shelters. Budget documents, however, show a stark gap between the expenditure estimates and the actual spending on transgender welfare schemes. While nearly ₹250 crore has been allocated since the beginning of the comprehensive scheme in FY22, spending stands at around ₹13 crore.

"Only a handful of Garima Grehs have received government funding," says Subramaniam. Several components of the scheme, she adds, remain unimplemented. "Even the scholarship section on the portal is non-functional," she

says, adding that other planned measures, such as state-level transgender protection cells, are yet to come up in many regions.

Aastha, a Delhi High Court lawyer working with the community (who goes by only the first name), says the impact of most schemes, including health insurance, has been minimal. "It's not as though people aren't applying. The applications remain pending for months, with no updates. The portal itself is inaccessible for days."

Officially, TGID cards must be issued within one month of the application. Vihaan Vee, a Bengaluru-based researcher and queer activist, says it took him six months to get his card.

"First, the district magistrates take days to sign the application. Then, it can get rejected multiple times, and you won't even understand why," he says. "They ask for ID proofs in Section 6 and 7, and address proofs under Section 7 (for TG certificates). Since many transgender people have fled from their homes, arranging all documents is a challenge."

Subramaniam adds there have been no sustained government campaigns to encourage registrations. Besides, the community, she says, is largely digitally ignorant. Even among officials, sensitisation is uneven. Aastha says some district magistrates demand surgery certificates to clear TGID applications, though these aren't required. Accessing healthcare benefits under the Transgender Ayushman Bharat card, Aastha adds, is similarly challenging because even when insurance is approved, the hospital staff are often unaware of the scheme.

## What now?

With the Bill approved, there is heightened uncertainty. Vee, who holds both a TG card and certificate, says he doesn't feature in its 2026 definition. He's unsure how the medical board will establish his identity, or how transparent the process would be.

लेसिया स्कूल में प्रेजेंटेशन सेरेमनी मनाई



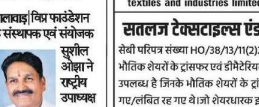
